



PHOTOGRAPHY YEAR 13 SUMMER INDEPENDENT LEARNING TASK

The summer holidays are a very important time for the development of your Component 1 coursework. The time off college is a great opportunity to further your own work and make a really good start to Year 13. Your teacher will give you more information about these tasks. The tasks that you should have completed when you return to college in September are:

Artist research and written responses

- Research **two** artists who have inspired or will inspire your work. You should find out all you can about the artist and/or the project the work is from. We would like you to really broaden your research skills and rely on more than just the internet for this. Try to cover 3 different sources for information during your research; you could visit a gallery to view work first hand, watch videos on or by the artist, read articles in magazines, books etc.
- All research should be printed (or exhibitions photographed if permitted) and saved as this will make up part of your research folder for the written personal study.
- Produce 2 written pieces of artist research and an in-depth personal response to each of their work. Try to go into more depth when learning about the artists' work than you perhaps did during Year 12, so you can demonstrate a clear understanding of their work. You could also compare and contrast the work of these two artists.

Own photoshoot (primary source material)

- Use the extra time off over the summer to produce at least one photoshoot for your project. You may visit different locations or simply have more time to plan out and produce a really thorough series of quality images for use in your project. One photoshoot is just the minimum, feel free to take as many as possible.
