New College is committed to providing students with a high-quality Careers Education and Guidance Service. Our aims include helping students to make informed and realistic decisions about their education and employment plans.

You will find careers support throughout the curriculum, and progression will be a key focus as part of your course. Progress Tutors support you as you plan your next steps after leaving college, whether you plan to go to university, an apprenticeship, or employment. They will encourage you to research your options and support you along the way.

The Careers Programme is made up four main strands:

SUBJECT-SPECIFIC EMPLOYER AND HE ENCOUNTERS/OPTIC

Subject areas are expected to integrate at least one employer encounter and one HE encounter for all students who study their course. This usually takes the form of a trip, workshop or visiting speaker.

TUTORIALS

Much of the careers programme is delivered through tutorials, where students can receive support on searching for potential career paths, and completing university and apprenticeship applications

PERSONAL GUIDANCE

All students have the opportunity to meet with a Careers Advisor for one-to-one careers appointments.
