### **Indepth Specialist Investigation**





**Purpose:** This investigation will form the foundations of your next assignment and give you the opportunity to explore different specialist areas before selecting the one you would like to investigate further.

**Aim:** To investigate creative specialisms and the work of creative practitioners showing an appreciation for their working style, media and techniques.

**Assessment:** This investigation will form part of the B1 Personal Progression assignment.

## Part 1





Task 1 Initial Research

Select 3 specialist areas from the list below.

- Fine Art
- Photography
- Fashion & Textiles
- Graphic Design
- Printmaking
- Illustration
- Interior Design
- Architecture

Gather information from different sources such as books, websites, YouTube, interviews and magazines.

Investigate the following for each of the 3 specialist areas:

- What the specialist area is (Definition/explanation)
- Different sub areas within the specialism. For example, you could be a landscape or residential architect
- What qualifications you would need to work in the specialist areas/professions
- Specialist skills needed
- Media and techniques used
- Earning potential
- Examples of artwork/projects created within the specialisms

Present your research creatively and include the following in your investigation:

- Short biographies that introduce the artist/practitioners
- Any relevant events in their life (that have influenced their work)
- Examples of their work
- Details about their working process including the media and techniques they use/d
- Describe their work and their use of the formal elements Describe the meanings and concepts behind their work





# Task 3 Artistic Responses

Create 3 pieces of art inspired by the working style of each of your 3 chosen artists/practitioners. For example:

Martin Parr = photograph

Joseph Cornell = collage

Henrietta Harris = painting

\*Note: These responses do not have to be large scale (min A5). Aim to produce small high-quality pieces.

#### Task 4 Presentation

Task 2 & 3 should be presented creatively. For example:

- Handmade book
- Journal style (use a small sketchbook)

- Concertina book
- Digital google slides or PowerPoint
- Or you might have your own idea
