### Year 13

It is wonderful to see our year 13 students receiving their university offers and securing apprenticeships. # Year 12

Please note from the list of dates below, the last college day for year 12 is Progression Day on Weds 3 July. Progression day is a vital part of the calendar and all students must attend in order to progress to year 13.

# All students

Our Revision Countdown to internal and external examinations and controlled assessments is well underway, and we wish students all the best with these. There is still time to make a significant difference with structured preparation, even though some are only a few days after we return from the Easter break. Please remember that exams for Applied General exams such as BTEC and CTEC are set externally and are a mandatory part of the course. They can't be rearranged or taken again for year 13 students. Please see important information later in this letter regarding the exams, and take note of the following advice to help students perform to the best of their ability:

- A healthy diet and getting some exercise are crucial to support good physical and mental health.
- Getting into a good sleep routine will help with your preparations as well as your performance on the day.
- Plan ahead to make sure your revision is structured. This will help to reduce your anxiety as well as maximising your performance.

# **Exams and assessments**

As mentioned above, year 12 students will sit their formal progression exams in May and these are used to check that students are ready for a second year of study. These are internal exams but we use the same protocols in place for external exams in order to give students experience of the procedures. Students should attend their lessons as normal when they do not have an exam. Please arrive at 8.45am for morning exams and 1.00pm for afternoon exams, and check Cedar in advance for venues and seat numbers. Switch off your phone and leave it in your bag with any watches, calculator cases etc. Wear warm clothing as you will not be allowed to take an outdoor coat into the exam room.

Many students, including most year 13 students and some in year 12, will also sit formal external **examinations** and controlled assessments from now until June. Please note that the JCQ contingency date is 26 June which means that if an exam is cancelled nationally this date will be used as the alternative. It is important to note that the regulations are strict and are set by the examination board regulator, JCQ. We do not have any flexibility with dates and times except in the event of exam clashes, and there will be no opportunity to sit a missed exam within the series. Absence from an exam without evidence of a substantial reason can result in failing overall. Students must contact student services (ncp-studentservices@nclt.ac.uk) and also their Progress Tutor on the day of the exam or earlier to make the college aware of their circumstances or the reason for their absence. Appropriate advice can then be given, including information about whether or not the student needs to provide any documentary evidence and whether or not they need to complete any paperwork for the examination boards if the exam is external. Applications for special consideration must be supported by the senior leadership team and it is important that students contact student services on the date of their exam. I would strongly recommend that all students read the FAQs for exams carefully and visit the exams office in the LRC if anything is unclear. This document gives details of absence procedures and special consideration.

Cedar will show your candidate number, as well as details of times, venues and seat numbers for all internal and external examinations. Again, please arrive at 8.45am for morning exams and 1.00pm for afternoon exams. Switch off your phone and leave it in your bag with any watches, calculator cases etc. Wear warm clothing as you will not be allowed to take an outdoor coat into the exam room. Frequently asked questions about exams and assessments will be placed on our website under 'Support'.



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# **Attendance and Holidays**

Holidays taken during term time cannot be authorised and can have a significant impact on academic progress. In some cases, where attendance is already low, holiday absence will result in escalation of intervention levels. Please support the college in trying to ensure that missed learning is minimised and refer to the term dates and exam timetables when booking holidays.
