Watch and analyse and re-cap how **choreographic devices** are used in the professional piece Rooster by Christopher Bruce. With reference to all 8 sections.

Choreographic Device	Motif Development
Canon (reverting, simultaneous, loose, cumulative)	Retrograde (reverse)
Unison	Change the energy- quality/tempo/dynamics
Question & answer/call & response	Change the space (level/direction/pathway)
Accumulation	Fragment (change the order)
Motif Development	Change the relationship (canon/duet/unison/contact)
Complimentary & contrasting	Instrumentation (same movement on a different body part)
Repetition	Add in new movements
Highlights & climax	Repetition- repeat parts or all
Mirroring	Change the size- enlarge/exaggerate/condense/shrink
Positioning/relationship of dancers
