Summer Independent Learning - Year 12-13

Task 1 - Performance

Create a programme of music that you will perform as part of the progression task. This must be between **10-12 minutes** and consist of **3 or more** pieces of music from at **least two areas of study** (Jazz/Western Classical Tradition/Music Theatre/Pop and Rock). If you are using performance as 25% of the qualification, this should be at least 2 pieces, with a time limit of 6-8 minutes.
