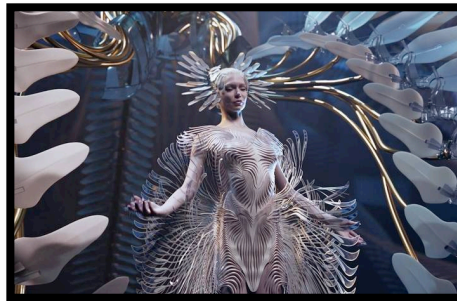


BTEC 540 Diploma Art and Design Practice

Indepth Contextual Investigation



Purpose: This investigation will be an introduction to the different specialist areas incorporated into the course.

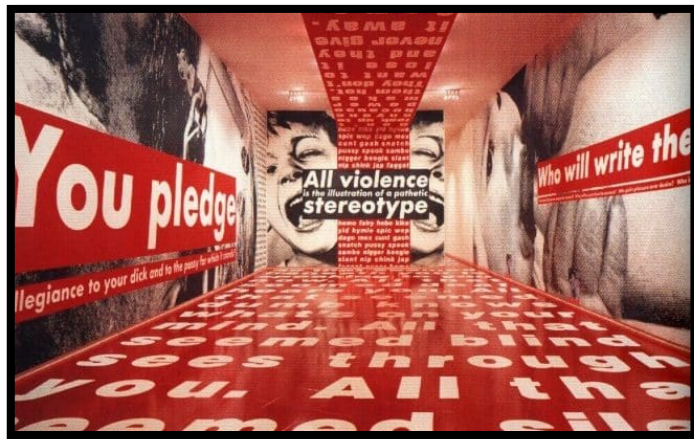
Part 1

Task 2 Creative Investigation

Present your research creatively and include the following in your investigation:

- Short biographies that introduce the artist
- Any relevant events in their life (that have influenced their work)
- Examples of their work
- Details about their working process including the media and techniques they use/d
- Describe their work and their use of the formal elements (look these up)
- Describe the meanings and concepts behind their work

Task 3 Artistic Responses

Create 5 pieces of art inspired by the working style of each of your 5 chosen artists/practitioners. **For example:**

Martin Parr = photograph

Joseph Cornell = collage

Henrietta Harris = painting

***Note:** These responses do not have to be large scale (min A5). Aim to produce small high-quality pieces.

Task 4 Presentation

Task 2 & 3 should be presented creatively. For example:

- Handmade book
- Journal style (use a small sketchbook)
- Concertina book
- Digital – google slides or PowerPoint
- Or you might have your own idea
